• Trip Pooling & Caravan Rules

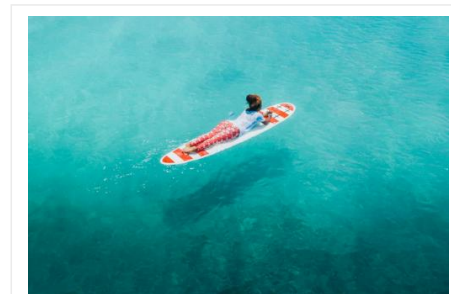
